Electronics have large quantities of reusable materials which can be extracted for valuable use. Electronics also have hazardous materials which may pose a threat to the environment and human health, if not disposed of properly. Broken or obsolete electronics should be recycled in an environmentally sound manner as it is good for the environment and our facility.

UNICOR (Federal Prison Industries, Inc.) will test equipment for reuse. All hard drives will be wiped with Department of Defense approved software. Monitors will be evaluated for reuse, recycling into color TV's, or sent to a glass recycling facility; electronics that cannot be reused will be remanufactured and sold for their commodity value.
